




# **Drive Digital Empowerment**

Despite being "the Heart of Silicon Valley," San José's digital divide disproportionately affects low-income residents, leaving many without the tools and resources needed to pursue their educational and professional goals. To close this divide, we are partnering with the Library to provide opportunities for young people and adults to access tools and practice skills that are essential to living and working in the digital world.







# 41,000

# Workshops in 3 Different Languages

Digital skill building workshops are offered in 3 different languages -- English, Spanish, and Vietnamese -- to ensure equitable access.



Coding and STEAM Learning Labs for K-12 students expose over 21,000 youth annually to the world of technology and coding



Residents have access to devices and connectivity at the Library, with 270,000+ hours used across 719 free public computers (average of 22,000 hours per month)

# **Digital Inclusion Fund**

In 2023, the San José City Council selected SJPLF to administer and manage the City's Digital Inclusion Fund, a grant program that aims to close the digital divide over the next ten years by connecting 41,000 households to the internet and providing them with the digital skills needed to thrive.



### \$3 million

Since its inception in 2020, the fund has awarded more than \$3 million to over three dozen community-based organizations to reach underserved residents in their native languages.

### **Digital Empowerment Programs**

Digital Empowerment programs provide access to digital literacy and education through high-quality coding, robotics, and computer science experiences, including workshops and Summer Learning Labs.

# **Early Education**

SJPLF supports a variety of Library programs and materials that provide equitable early education opportunities to our community, so children and their caregivers can learn about new ideas, skills, and possibilities, as well as a safe space to explore, play, connect, and grow.

# 1,000 Books **Before Kindergarten**



1,000 Books Before Kindergarten is a fun and FREE program to encourage families to read stories with their child. Data shows this helps children

- build their language skills
- contributes to their healthy development
- gives them the skills they need to succeed in school
- and develops a lifelong love of reading.

### Did You Know?



Almost 80% of a child's brain is developed before their third birthday, making those first 36 months the most critical time to engage in brain building activities.

# SJ Learns and Tutoring Matters

**SJ Learns** funds after school programs for San José students in transitional kindergarten through third grade. Highquality extended learning programs provide crucial academic support for struggling students in the classroom. They are especially important for students from low-income families who cannot afford fee-based alternatives.

Tutoring Matters provides low-income San José students in grades 4-12 with access to high-quality tutoring services. The program aims to offset the impact of learning loss and uplift children to higher levels of academic achievement.

# Adult Literacy & English as a Second Language (ESL)

Literacy impacts all aspects of a person's life, spanning academics, career trajectory, socio-economic status, health and more. Through one-on-one and group tutoring sessions, the Library's Adult Literacy & English as a Second Language program is dedicated to meeting adults where they are, helping them reach their English reading, writing, and speaking skill goals.

# **Build the Workforce**

Investing in a skilled workforce not only helps individuals, it also strengthens our community and supports the City's growth and prosperity.

# Family Friend and Neighbor Caregiver Support Network (FFN)



FFN connects caregivers of children five and under to learning and workforce development opportunities and a peer community. Last year, participants received more than 3,200 collective professional development hours during the program.

144 caregivers collectively supported 557 children last year

# **Career Online High School**

Career Online High School offers adults the opportunity to earn an accredited high school diploma and a career certificate online for free, an important step for participants to advance in their career or pursue higher education once they graduate.



83 students enrolled in Career Online High School last year



297 scholarships have been awarded over the course of the program

210 adult learners have completed the program to date, with an impressive 75% completion rate, the highest nationwide for a program of its kind.








# Resilience Corps Learning Pathway

Resilience Corps Learning Pathway is a jobs program for young adults designed to address economic and workforce development needs while aiding in learning recovery and staffing shortages for K-8 grade students in expanded learning programs. Resilience Corps Associates are hired by SJPLF and placed with after school programs across the city. The Associates earn a living wage while working with children and receiving valuable career development training.

We support arts and crafts programs, activity kits, and cultural events at Library branches, and help fund the Library's collections and events. Gifts to SJPLF help increase hands-on artistic experiences and expand access to cultural resources at the San José Public Library.
