NBC News Correspondent and *Boat Baby* author Vicky Nguyen to Headline San José Public Library Foundation's Signature Author Event

San José, California— The San José Public Library Foundation (SJPLF) is thrilled to announce that tickets are now available for its Signature Author Event on November 15, 2025, featuring award-winning NBC News anchor and correspondent Vicky Nguyen, author of the powerful memoir *Boat Baby*. Before joining NBC News in New York, Vicky spent 12 years reporting and anchoring for NBC Bay Area, where she became a trusted voice and a familiar presence in the community.

Nguyen will share her remarkable journey as the child of Vietnamese refugees and how her family's story shaped her life and career. With her signature warmth, candor, and insight, Nguyen will captivate the audience while spotlighting the importance of resilience, community, and access to opportunity.

At the event, Santa Clara County Board Supervisor Betty Duong, whose family moved to San José following the Vietnam War, will lead a lively conversation and audience Q & A with Vicky. The proud daughter of immigrants, Betty is the first Vietnamese American and the first Asian American woman to serve on the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors and a lifelong resident of Santa Clara County District Two. Betty spent her childhood translating for her parents, family members and neighbors, helping them navigate government agencies, social services, and safety net resources.

These programs bridge the digital divide, prepare the workforce, promote literacy, and strengthen cultural connections across our community.

She represents more than 400,000 residents of San José in the Downtown, East Side, Southside and surrounding neighborhoods. District Two is also home to the historic and iconic Japantown, Little Saigon, Little Italy, and Little Portugal neighborhoods.
